

# low to get here

Linlithgow is well serviced by ScotRail, with direct services from Edinburgh, Glasgow, Dunblane, Stirling and Falkirk.

**Trains:** 

Through bus services are available from Edinburgh, Falkirk and Stirling. (First bus services 38 and X38) Less regular routes from most other parts of West Lothian.

Via the M9 from the West (eastbound), leave at J4 (no exit at J3 this carriageway).
Via the M9 from the East (westbound), leave at J3.

Pay and Display car park behind Cross House, and other on street time-limited parking. Free long stay car park behind Tesco, but note parking in main Tesco park is time-limited. On Sunday, owing to the Pedal for Scotland event, many on-street parking places will be coned off and not available: there will be traffic congestion, so try to leave vehicles at either end of the town.
